

the Governor, two members of the Legislature and two educators. And their job is to study our presidential primary system and to recommend back to us whether or not any changes may be needed and we are asking them to look at the feasibility of Nebraska joining together with other states to conduct a regional primary as they are in the south, look at procedures used in other states, look at the possibility of the caucus system. In other words, we're establishing a commission to report back to us what needs to be done. This commission would not be a funded committee, as such. It would be just one of volunteers who would look at this and report back to us as to whether we need some changes in our presidential primary system. With that, that's what this amendment does. I would urge your adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Is there any discussion on the Rupp...on the Withem amendment? If not, the question is the adoption of the Withem amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the Withem amendment. Record, Mr. Clerk, please. Record, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Withem's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Withem amendment is adopted. Anything further?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have nothing further on the bill at this time.

PRESIDENT: Okay, we're back on the advancement of the bill. Senator Rupp. Senator Withem. Excuse me.

SENATOR WITHEM: Yeah, I would merely move the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT: Okay, you have heard the closing. The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. We will take up LB 390, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first order of business on 390 are E & R amendments, Senator.

PRESIDENT: Senator Scott Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. President, I move we adopt the E & R
