

please, Senator Rod Johnson. Senator Labeledz, please check in. Senator Schellpeper, record your presence. Senator Withem, please. Senator Baack and Senator Ashford. All present. Twenty-five votes necessary to reconsider. Roll call, Mr. Clerk, in reverse order.

CLERK: (Roll call taken in reverse order. See page 2617 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to reconsider.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion prevails. Back to the motion to refer to committee. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Let's see, where are we now?

SPEAKER BARRETT: We are on the motion to refer to committee. This was the reconsideration.

SENATOR LAMB: Reconsideration of the amendment, right?

CLERK: Reconsideration of the referral vote to committee, Senator. So the motion pending is to refer the bill to committee.

SENATOR LAMB: Okay. Well, see I am squeezed in here between the time line and I realize that, and I apologize to the body for it, and I hope you all know that this is not...I did not want it to be this way, and if I offended Senator Vard Johnson, I am sorry, but I was trying to call to his attention that in previous speeches on this floor, he has indicated that the majority should rule, and at one point we had a situation where he was it seemed to me thwarting the majority. I have a number of people say that I should not withdraw the motion, but I would just like to make a couple of comments first, and I regret the fact that it has taken so much time and that is not my style. And, Senator Morehead, we are talking about different statutes rather than the ones that cover the mobile homes on interstates. Senator Chambers, any vehicle that you see moving on the interstate is not involved. We are not talking about interstate. I don't move houses but the Department of Roads does not give permits...it would have to be a very special case if you ever saw one on the interstate because the department has to approve it. I am being squeezed in here between the time line. If the amendment did get on the bill it would be difficult, I guess, for the bill drafter to get it down here before the midnight deadline.
