

issue has been around for a while and it has had a chance to be on the books for a while. It was up there on the Clerk's desk for a week or so and we have had a chance to lobby the issue and discuss the issue and talk about it. Let me just say that this remains as burning and as significant an issue this year as it has in all previous years. It seems to me that there is some kind of fundamental fairness that the Legislature ought to observe here. The commission has fought this fight over and over again. These advocacy agents have been down here over and over again and the Legislature stood by them. I would hope that the Legislature could send that message to the executive branch and to allow us to move on to other public policy issues. It is unfair to have the commission come down here and spend as much time and energy as it does simply to perpetuate itself because of a tax against it by the bureaucracy. I urge you to advance and adopt this veto override.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the amendment by Senator Landis, override, override the advocacy agency. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Record vote read as found on page 2732 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to override that portion of the Governor's veto.

PRESIDENT: The veto is overridden. Do you have any more, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President, I do. Mr. President, the next item for consideration is on LB 781. I have a report from the Appropriations Committee recommending that the Legislature override Section 25 of the bill, some \$43,000 for a fire suppression system in the Headquarters Building at Ft. Robinson State Park.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner, please.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, this is the one motion the committee did vote to recommend. It affects the facility at Ft. Robinson that is operated by the Historical Society. Those of you who are familiar with the building, it is the old Headquarters Building which houses a number of artifacts, other historically significant items. It has a particularly unique library, in the basement, by the way, of those of you who have been it. It is a frame structure, that obviously there is
