

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I missed something. Some people are chuckling. Senator Haberman, I was not going to support your override but when I look at how much has been given away to every other powerful interest, the rag-tag, bobtailed farmer can be given a bit of something by the Legislature. So, although it goes against my principle of the giveaways, if anything is going to be done as a symbolic gesture, I am going to part with that principle that I have of being against the giveaways and make a symbolic gesture of trying to help the farmer. And I don't think if this bill passes, or if the override is successful, that the farmers' problems will be solved.

Mr. President, the certificates accompanying the overrides of LB 780 and LB 781 are ready for your signature.

PRESIDENT: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign these proposals as President of the Legislature.

CLERK: Mr. President, the last bills read on Final Reading this afternoon have been presented to the Governor. (See page 2734 regarding LB 523, LB 523A, LB 708 and LB 708A.) That is all that I have, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to sine...to adjourn sine die. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Mr. Clerk, roll call vote. Senator Landis, was it not you that asked for a roll call vote? Machine vote. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.
