PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Moore, then Senator Abboud.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. President, I move we adjourn sine die.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Clerk, do you have anything to put in?

CLERK: I have nothing to put in, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Okay. You've heard the motion. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 7 ayes, 22 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to adjourn sine die.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. Senator Abboud, please, then Senator Barrett.

SENATOR ABOUD: Well, Mr. President, colleagues, I wasn't going to say anything about this particular proposal. I wasn't planning to say anything more about any of them until the last vote. I would just hope that you would oppose the override attempt for the reasons that have been stated earlier. We really don't have the money in reserve. This is a rather sizeable item as well. It is a rather sizeable item that will have a direct impact on the reserve. I would urge the body to reject the override attempt. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Barrett, please, then Senator Dierks.

SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I've taken a very conservative attitude on the overriding of gubernatorial vetoes. I have in the past and have continued to exercise that today.
