

CLERK: Mr. President, items for the record. New bills. (Read titles for the first time to LB 982-990. See pages 199-210 of the Legislative Journal.)

In addition to those items, Mr. President, the Government Committee would like to announce that Senator Coordsen has been selected as Vice-Chairman of that committee for the 1988 session. That's offered by Senator Baack as Chair.

Mr. President, I have a Reference Report referring certain gubernatorial appointments to the appropriate Standing Committee for confirmation hearing. (See pages 201-03 of the Legislative Journal.) That's all that I have, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We will move on to LB 369, please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 369 is on General File. It was offered by the Urban Affairs Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 20 of this year, referred to the Urban Affairs Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending by the Urban Affairs Committee, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hartnett, please.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President and members of the body, the amendments become the bill, in essence, because what we have done is that when we heard the bill first by the...it was a bill brought by the City of Omaha to us, is that it narrowed the authority that Omaha had in condemning property. Originally, it was...what they were asking for was the same rights that the Department of Roads have and what we have done is we have narrowed and I think it's a very difficult bill to understand and I guess that's why I have some pictures or drawings on the handout that I passed out to you and maybe that's a little ways to go through that rather than trying to read it. So I could refer you to your handout that I passed out to you, in the current situation that I have here is we have 6th Street, we have Fred's Parking lot, we have Fred's store, we have Al's parking lot, we have Al's store, we have Pete's parking lot and Pete's store. That's the current situation as it would be in the City of Omaha. This only deals with the City of Omaha, no place else. And if the city, under the right of eminent domain...if you will turn to the second page, the second
