PRESIDENT: Senator Barrett, would you like to close on your motion?

SENATOR BARRETT: No close.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the resolution. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please. A record vote has been asked for.

CLERK: (Record vote read as found on pages 213-14 of the Legislative Journal.) 33 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution.

PRESIDENT: The resolution is adopted. Mr. Clerk, do you have any new bills this morning?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Mr. President, new bills. (Read LBs 1001-1009 by title for the first time as found on pages 214-16 of the Legislative Journal.) That is all that I have, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. We'll move on then to General File, LB 757, Senator Chambers' bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 757 is a bill introduced by Senator Chambers. (Title read.) The bill was introduced on January 23 of last year, referred to the General Affairs Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. It was considered last year on April 8. At that time Senator Chambers had amendments to the bill that were adopted. There was a motion to advance the bill. It failed.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers. Okay, Senator Chambers, would you like to explain the bill, for starters?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, Friday is never a good Friday for me. I don't know why they attach that term to that day because even the one with whom it is associated, it wasn't a good Friday for him. So, it's carrying out that bad tradition. There are not many people here. This is a bill that we did deal with last year, so in order to try to make you aware of some of the major aspects of it, I have passed around a handout, and if you're interested in the details of the bill which may not be discussed at all, it
