SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you. LB 790 is a 33 section bill which relate primarily to provisions which have become obsolete because of the passage of the Nebraska Juvenile Code and to correct the terminology in other sections because of the passage of LB 249 in 1985 which changed the term "crippled child" to "medically handicapped child". The bill also repeals sections which are duplicative of other sections in the Criminal Code. I urge you to advance this bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Landis, please. Okay. Any further discussion? If not, the question is the advancement of the bill to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Need a little help. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance 790.

PRESIDENT: LB 790 is advanced to E & R Initial. LB 791.
