that somebody could apply to become a race track, conduct no races, but simply do simulcasting. Should that case occur, I am confident we can deal with that by statute. There would be nothing in the constitutional amendment which would require us to authorize a track for that particular purpose. With that I am going to close and ask you to advance the bill to Select File, or the amendment to Select File.
