LB 123, 170, 519, 582, 627

PRESIDENT: Okay. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senators Wesely and Remmers have a motion to indefinitely postpone the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator...

SENATOR HARTNETT: I would simply ask that it be held over.

PRESIDENT: Okay.

SENATOR HARTNETT: And I think that's agreed with Senator Wesely.

PRESIDENT: So ordered. Thank you. LB 519.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 519 was a bill offered by Senators Wesely, Chizek, Ashford, Pappas. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 22, referred to Business and Labor, advanced to General File. I have committee amendments from the Business and Labor Committee, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chizek, did you wish to handle those, or...

CLERK: Well, Mr. President, I do have a priority motion. Senator Chizek would move to bracket LB 519 until February 8.

PRESIDENT: Okay, Senator Chizek, please.

SENATOR CHIZEK: Yes, I am one of the co-sponsors. I have talked to those people who are on the bill and we are attempting to gather some information that wasn't available and I should have it by February 8. So I'm simply asking to bracket the bill till February 8th and hoping that we'll have this information in our hands.

PRESIDENT: Is there any objection? Any objection? If not, it is bracketed. Yes, it is bracketed. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LB 582 and LB 123. Anything else, Mr. Clerk, to put in before we knock it off?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely has amendments to be printed to LB 170. (See page 516 of the Legislative Journal.)
