PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the return of the bill to Select File. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. It requires 33 votes. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

PRESIDENT: The bill is returned. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: At this point I'd like to move the amendment of the emergency clause and, Senator Conway, I know you were going to vote before this point, but I would hope that the wisdom of the Senator from Wayne would prevail from the day. At this point, Mr. President, I move the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? If not, the question is the adoption of the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Mr. President, I move at this point that we move it to E & R for Engrossing.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. Move on to LB 362.

CLERK: (Read LB 362 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 362 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.
