LB 90, 418, 419, 428

Mr. President, I have amendments to be printed from Senator Hannibal to LB 418 and to LB 419, and Senator Smith and Moore to LB 428. That is all that I have. (Amendments are found on page 592 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Chizek, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CHIZEK: I object.

PRESIDENT: The question is, you've heard the motion to adjourn. All those in favor vote aye. Okay. Senator Withem.

SENATOR WITHEM: I thought maybe I could...this is very presumptuous of me. I thought maybe I could yell louder than Senator Higgins. I know that's not true, but I know Senator Higgins was going to raise a point of order.

PRESIDENT: All right. The question is, shall we adjourn? Senator Barrett, for what purpose do you rise?

SPEAKER BARRETT: Mr. President, may I just make an announcement before the vote is taken?

PRESIDENT: Well, it's all right with me. As long as you don't talk about whether we adjourn or not. (laughter)

SPEAKER BARRETT: Buses will be available at the west entrance for those people who want to take advantage of the meeting downtown with representatives of the Nebraska Mental Health Community. A couple of comments on next week because some of you have been asking. On Monday, perhaps a little Final Reading, short. Priority bills are beginning, 88 priority bills. Senator Labeledz will have LB 814 on the agenda. The Health Committee will have 1012 on the agenda. Time permitting, back to Select File. On Tuesday a little more Final Reading. The helmet bill will be back up on Tuesday along with another bill that has been held, LB 180; time permitting a little General File. That will give you an idea of the first two days. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR WITHEM: Yeah, I'm sorry, Mr. President, and it may seem
