Reading, Mr. Clerk, LB 705.

CLERK: (Read LB 705 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 705 pass? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 639 of the Legislative Journal.) 40 ayes, 3 nays, 4 present and not voting, 2 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 705 passes. Anything for the record? The call is raised.

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Your Committee on Government gives notice of hearing. Government Committee reports LB 612 to General File; LR 248CA to General File; LB 828 to General File with amendments, and LB 1166 indefinitely postponed. Those are all signed by Senator Baack as Chair. (See pages 640-41 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, sir. Moving to item number 8 on the agenda, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Vard Johnson would move to reconsider the Final Reading vote on LB 428. Senator Johnson filed his motion on January 27. It may be found on page 528 of the Journal.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Vard Johnson, please.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, LB 428 was read on Final Reading a week ago today. It received 23 affirmative votes, two short of the necessary votes for passage. I was absent a week ago today. I was in Oklahoma doing law business, because this is a part-time Legislature and people do have to make livings outside this Legislature. Since I was not here to vote on Final Reading, I filed the motion for reconsideration. I ask your indulgence. We need 30 votes to reconsider so that this measure, which is a necessary measure, has an opportunity to be voted on finally with 47 members of the Legislature here.
