SENATOR ELMER: Mr. Speaker, members, Senator Moore has offered the best suggestion for us. If we want the Legislature to work and to work in its fullest extent, as has been suggested earlier in the debate, I would suggest that we accept this, bracket the bill until tomorrow, and adjourn so that we can go to our hearings this afternoon.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lynch on the motion to bracket, followed by Senators Abboud, Chambers, Johnson. Senator Lynch waives.

SENATOR LYNCH: No.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, go ahead.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. Chairman and members, I guess everything, everything that Ernie alluded to, of course, is happening now. Senator Moore is the guy that just said a few minutes ago that the people that want this bill simply want victory. They don't want to save lives. It is not a very responsible statement, Scott. Lewis, 37, Danny Cramer, 21, Timothy Weimer, 36, Jim Bourbon, 38, Dave Wilwerding, 26, Jeff Chambers, 27, Rick Speck, 26, Pamela Stewart, 27, Todd Hubbard, 23, Dan (sic) Shaw, 21, Tom Kelly, 42, Terry Johnson, 28, Kurt Meyer, 26, those are the people you kill.
