PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Korshoj, please, then Senator Abboud.

SENATOR KORSHOJ: Mr. President and members, I will not speak on the bill itself. I want to tell you what happened in committee last year. And I do have a soft spot in my heart for this bill and I'll tell you why when I get done explaining what happened last year. We took Exec Session after Exec Session to try to get this bill in a workable condition. We told Senator Pirsch, we'll give you one more day, we'll give you one more day, and we strung it on and we strung it on. Finally, I don't know what day it was, I finally said, well, it's in such bad shape, maybe we should kill the bill. Senator Chizek kind of reared up out of his chair and he said, is that a motion? And I said, yeah, I'll make the motion to kill the bill, and we did kill the bill. And that's where the soft spot comes in my heart because from that day on they called me "Killer Korshoj", and I can't collect anything from this fund. I said, I'm not a felon for killing these bills. But this bill was not in shape and I'm going to make you a prediction that if you bring this bill to the floor, we are going to do the state a lot of good because it might be the last bill you hear this year. You think LB 775 had quite a long session, this bill, I will predict, will just tie us up for one heck of a lot of hours and I think you should vote support for the committee that has killed this bill twice. I'm sorry to say that they got ahead of me on the kill motion this year. All I got was a second, so I'm not as bad a killer as they say I am. But really consider that your committee has done a very good job on this bill, let's leave it right where it's at. And, Ernie, if you need any more time, that's all I have to say.
