

authorize any city or village to provide for the collection and removal of garbage or refuse upon any land within its corporate limits or zoning jurisdiction or upon streets, roads or alleys abutting such land which constitutes a public nuisance. The procedures and provisions of LB 934 are modeled after Sec. 15-268.01 and 15-268.02 which grant this same power to cities of the primary class, namely the City of Lincoln. Other municipalities also need the powers granted by this bill to enable them to better address the removal of such garbage or refuse which constitutes a public nuisance. The powers granted to municipalities in LB 934 would be in addition to those already in state law relating to public nuisances. LB 934 would enable cities and villages to require the owner, agent or tenant of such land to remove the garbage or refuse from the land and abutting streets, roads or alleys. Failure of the owner, agent or tenant to do so, after receiving proper notice, would allow the municipality to remove such garbage or refuse. Upon a determination by the municipality that accumulation of garbage or refuse is an immediate nuisance and hazard to public health and safety, LB 934 would require the city or village to remove it from the land within 48 hours after notice by personal service or following receipt of a certified letter. The bill would also require the municipality removing garbage or refuse according to this section to hold a hearing and assess the cost of removal against the land. And this bill is copied exactly like Lincoln's, so it should be in good order. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: LB 934 is advanced. LB 1100, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 1100 was a bill introduced by the Health and Human Services Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was introduced, Mr. President, in January of this year. It was referred to the Health and Human Services Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. I have Health Committee amendments pending, Mr. President.
