bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 1100.

PRESIDENT: LB 1100 is advanced. Mr. Speaker, would it be agreeable that we take 1100A and then perhaps you would like to have a few remarks about the priority bills, and so forth, before we adjourn? Okay, we'll take LB 1100A, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, 1100A was a bill introduced by Senator Wesely. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely, please.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Mr. President, briefly, 1110A again is needed to implement 1100. As you know, 1100 deals with licensure issues in the Health Department and 1100A is only Cash Funds out of that licensure out of the Bureau of Examining Boards. So there is no General Fund money, it's all cash money. I would move the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the explanation. All those in favor of 1100A please vote aye, opposed nay. Please vote. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 1100A.

PRESIDENT: LB 1100A is advanced. The Speaker has requested that we continue on with 1117 and 1117A, so we could probably work those in. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 1117 is a bill offered by the Education Committee and also signed by Senators Lamb and Scofield. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 14, referred to the Education Committee for public hearing, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Did you say you have no amendments? Mr. Clerk, did you say you have no amendments? Okay, Senator Withem, are you going to speak to the bill?
