labyrinthine in its ownership path and a reverter clause needs to have some elements on it, some clarification, some boundaries, if you will, and that's what 657 does and it moves those from the real property area, where this case law is more advanced, to the personal property area, and I support the bill.

**SPEAKER BARRETT:** Any other discussion? Senator Goodrich, anything further?

**SENATOR GOODRICH:** Not on the amendment.

**SPEAKER BARRETT:** Thank you. The question then is the adoption of the Goodrich amendment. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. On the amendment, have you all voted? Please record.

**CLERK:** 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Goodrich's amendment.

**SPEAKER BARRETT:** The amendment is adopted. Senator Goodrich, on the bill.

**SENATOR GOODRICH:** Mr. President, members of the body, the actual bill has been explained already in adoption of the amendments. I would just add that this has been reviewed by the Bar Association, for example, for any input that they wanted to have into it so we're not...we make sure we're not upsetting anybody's apple carts anywhere. And what we are doing is we're applying the reverter clause to personal property in the same provisions that we have already got it for real estate. I move the advancement of the bill.

**SPEAKER BARRETT:** Thank you. Any discussion on the advancement of 657? Seeing none, those in favor of the advancement of the bill please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record.

**CLERK:** 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 657.

**SPEAKER BARRETT:** LB 657 is advanced. Anything for the record?
