SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I think the existing language, with the amendments that we passed on Select, will take care of sites any place in the state, Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Then it is your conviction that the commission could establish a site at David City, or Minden, or Bellwood, or anywhere that they chose if they had the resources with which to work.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes, that would be no problem under the amendments already adopted.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Do you plan to try to get any state funding for this kind of project, Senator Schellpeper?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Not at the present time, no.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I see.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Probably never.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Probably never.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Um-huh.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Well, never is a long time.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Right. (Laughter.)

SENATOR SCHMIT: I don't suppose that that commits anyone else. I think we ought to take a look at it, but I'll not offer my amendment then, Senator Schellpeper, and I will support your amendment.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you.
