LB 948, 1114

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Remmers, on the advancement of LB 1114.

SENATOR REMMERS: Madam Chairman and members of the Legislature, LB 1114 would reduce the continuing education requirement from six hours to three hours in each two-year period for persons who solicit only crop insurance. Everyone involved in the discussion agreed that educational topics are extremely limited in this field and it's very difficult to develop a meaningful continuing education course which is six hours in length. The bill limits requirements for agents who solicit only crop insurance. I urge the advancement of the bill.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Wesely, on the advancement of 1114.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Senator Remmers. If Senator Hannibal were here, he would say, hallelujah, finally a continuing education bill that reduces the number of hours. I think this is a great trend and we ought to look at other ways in which we can do similar types of things.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Chambers, on the advancement of LB 1114.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam Chair, I don't get many opportunities to mess with Senator Remmers. The last time I did, in fact, was when I said if you took the "s" off his name, he's the same coming or going. But, Senator Rod Johnson, I think the same ones who are working on this have worked on the workload for the Agriculture Committee, so I'm going to support it. They did it to us, let's do it to whoever we're doing it to on this bill.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Remmers, there are no further lights.

SENATOR REMMERS: I simply urge the advancement of the bill.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Remmers' motion to advance LB 1114. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Mr. Clerk, record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 1114.

SENATOR LABEDZ: LB 1114 is advanced. LB 948, Mr. Clerk.
