LB 1159, LB 897, LB 903, LB 901, LB 909, LB 929, LB 1126, and LB 817 all are reported to Select File, some of which have E & R amendments attached, Mr. President. (See pages 1192-98 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, I have a request from Senator Higgins to add her name to LB 463 as co-introducer. I believe that is all that I have, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. May I introduce some guests, please, in the north balcony. Senator Coordsen has some guests from his area. We have 25 seniors from Crete High School at Crete, Nebraska and their teacher. Would you folks please stand and be recognized by your Legislature. Thank you for visiting us today. Move on to legislative resolutions, number 303.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 303 is a resolution introduced by Senator Wesely. It's on page 1174 of the Journal. (Read brief summary of resolution.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely, please.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Mr. President and members. This resolution is one to recognize the Department of History at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. I do so with great honor because I was a graduate student in history at that department when I was elected, in 1978. Never got my masters degree, instead I came down here and didn't finish up my work there. But I did have the chance to work with many of those people that are now being recognized through this resolution. The History Department has been an excellent one at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln for some time, and their excellence has even grown from those days when I was there to this point where they are now the number one department in the Big 8 Conference in terms of publication, and I would say probably in scholarly endeavor as well. They did publish 14 books in 1987, out of the 23 faculty members, and they are renowned, I think, as recognized now throughout the country. So, in recognition of their achievements in the UN-L Department of History and their publication record, I bring to you this resolution and ask for its adoption.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the resolution. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.
