

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Morehead, please.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Mr. President and colleagues, if this is a particular concern to Senator McFarland, and if some of you feel a necessity to have this spelled out in the legislation, I can see no harm in doing so, and so I would accept Senator McFarland's amendment, and any remaining time I will give to Senator Landis.

PRESIDENT: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, Senator Morehead and I have looked down the list. We have about seven amendments coming on this issue, and Senator Morehead and I see at least two of them on their face are acceptable as written. This is one of them. Senator Hall has an amendment of his four or five that he has in that is acceptable. Senator Labedz has an amendment, the language of which if we can just find a little better way of stating it is acceptable. The rest are not. I would like to try to save the time of the body to get to those. Let's vote on the McFarland amendment and then get to the ones that there is disagreement about on the floor.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Marsh, please. Okay, you are the last one, so, Senator McFarland, did you wish to close?

SENATOR McFARLAND: I would just urge the adoption of the amendment, Mr. President. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the question is the adoption of the McFarland amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay on adoption of Senator McFarland's amendment to LB 88, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The McFarland amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment from Senator McFarland. Senator, I have AM1883 in front of me. It is on page 906 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator McFarland.

SENATOR McFARLAND: Okay, thank you. I just want to make sure.
