personal service limitation which does not appear in the system's manual, Nebraska Accounting Systems Manual, but is the statutory one so it's clear that that definition of personal service limitations is retained through fiscal year '88-89 as it was adopted in LB 780. With that, I would move adoption of that committee amendment to Section 1 of...or, excuse me, of Section 5 of the bill. It's technical in nature totally.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Any discussion on Senator Warner's amendment to Section 5? Senator Vard Johnson, your light is on, do you care to discuss that amendment? Thank you. Those in favor then of the amendment offered by Senator Warner to 1041, please vote aye, opposed nay. On the Warner amendment. Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Section 1 of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The amendment is adopted. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, the rest of the sections, there's a variety, all of the members of the Appropriations Committee will be discussing different sections and which the Clerk has, I believe, the sheet which shows which member of the Appropriations Committee will explain the section, which if the Chair has it also, we probably ought to...we can use to follow that as to whom you would recognize. In this case, Senator Scofield will be explaining Section 7.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Thank you, Senator Warner. Mr. Speaker and members, moving on in LB 1041, in Section 7 it's the Educational Telecommunications Commission. You will recall last year that we appropriated money to reerect the Bassett Television Tower which was torn down during an ice storm. This section simply reduces the appropriation for the replacement of that tower by a \$211,000 figure because the bids for the tower were lower than the original estimate. The committee did not offer any change in terms of a committee amendment. That's the original language of the bill. There is a related section coming up later, Section 34 addresses further items relative to the Educational Telecommunications Commission. With that, I would urge your adoption of this section, unless there are questions.
