CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LR 309 is adopted. LR 310.

CLERK: Mr. President, 310 was a resolution introduced by Senator Rogers. It's found on page 1228. It congratulates the community of "Elvira" on the occasion of its centennial.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Rogers.

SENATOR ROGERS: Mr. President and members, first of all I'd kind of like to explain the pronunciation, it's Elyria. It's a community founded 100 years ago.
