LR 314, 315

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Owen Elmer, please.

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. Oxford is a very neat little agricultural community on Highway 136, between Edison and Orleans, along the Republican River.
