PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Beyer, did you wish to talk about the bill? I know better than to cut you off.

SENATOR BEYER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I think it's been pretty well discussed and that we would appreciate your advancing the bill.

PRESIDENT: Okay. The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. I need a little help. Thank you. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 833.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Move on to Select File, please. LB 1100.

CLERK: Mr. President, 1100 has been considered on Select File on two different occasions. A series of amendments have been adopted. The first amendment I have to the bill is by Senators Morehead, Hannibal and Miller. It's AM2394.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hannibal, are you going to handle that?

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Yes, Mr. President, if you like, if I might ask the Clerk, Mr. Clerk, we were on an amendment to the amendment when we left off? Or do we start over without that?

CLERK: I'm sorry, you're absolutely right, Senator. Senator Lynch...Mr. President, the amendment by Senators Hannibal and Morehead was pending. Senator Lynch had then offered an amendment to that amendment. That's found on page 1293.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lynch, please.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. President and members, I don't want to spend a lot of time on this but I felt, out of principle, I should probably explain where I'm coming from. In the past, nursing homes for the mentally retarded did not have to go through certificate of need because they were licensed by the state as
