CLERK: Mr. President, 160 is on Select file. I have E & R amendments on the bill, first of all, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Scott Moore.

CLERK: E & R amendments, Senator.

SENATOR MOORE: I move we adopt the E & R amendments to LB 160.

SPEAKER BARRETT: You have heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments. All in favor say aye. Opposed no. Carried.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment to the bill from Senators Wesely and Morehead. I understand, Senator, you want to withdraw this amendment. This is AM2413, Senator, do you want to withdraw?

SENATOR WESELY: I would like to speak to it first.

CLERK: Excuse me.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. The amendment that I filed with Senator Moore on LB 160, and I haven't had a chance to talk to Senator Morehead about it, but it does deal with the bill that we introduced, LB 879. That bill was, I think, an important bill that's been before this body a couple, three years dealing with already retired teachers. There is currently a situation where these teachers with 25 or more years of service have a minimum benefit level of \$155 maintained in the statutes. These teachers sometimes have served not only 25 years but 30, 35,
