SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The motion before the body is to adjourn. I would exercise the prerogative of the Chair at this point and recommend that we not adjourn and process this one amendment before our adjournment for tonight. We have a motion also pending, hopefully, to cease debate. With that, with that, the question is, shall we adjourn until tomorrow morning? Machine vote has been requested. Those in favor of that motion please vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 3 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to adjourn.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The motion to adjourn fails. Senator Labeledz, you were next in speaking order.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Call the question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. Shall debate now cease? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Shall debate close? Please record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 4 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.
