further with the questions that some people are raising that I don't think deal with the real policy choices that we have and I think there are two obvious choices, as I mentioned before. SPEAKER BARRETT: If there are no objections, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion from Senator Warner to be printed in the Journal. Mr. President, new study resolution. New study resolution, LR 346, offered by Senator Withem. (Read brief synopsis of resolution. See pages 1532-33 of the Journal.) That is all that I have, Mr. President. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Back to the discussion on the Vard Johnson amendment. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I call the question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The question has been called. Are there five hands? There are. Those in favor of ceasing debate please vote aye, opposed nay. Shall debate now close? Please record.
