cooperative kinds of programs that use Omaha resources and bring them across the state to whatever community might be interested in being served with some kind of arts program, but I do think it is right and proper to put some kind of limitation on there so that we don't simply end up subsidizing Omaha arts organizations without making sure that that kind of distribution of arts across the state occurs. So let me restate. There is \$246,000 that is not earmarked in any kind of fashion or designated in any kind of fashion. But I was a bit concerned the other day when this amendment passed with a lot of rural votes, with a lot of assumptions about what might or might not happen with no guidance from the Legislature, and I think this is a prudent way of making sure that our intentions are honored here, that we do want a cooperative endeavor between Omaha which clearly has superior arts resources and that they are brought across the state as well.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Any other discussion on the Warner amendment? Any closing comment, Senator Warner? Thank you. Those in favor of the adoption of the Warner amendment to 1041 please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, please.
