CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Moore's amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The amendment is adopted. Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Now that we have adopted the amendment and made the bill...got the bill in better form, I urge for its readvancement.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Any discussion? Those in favor of the readvancement of the bill, please say aye. Opposed no. Ayes have it. Carried. The bill is readvanced. This might be a particularly appropriate time to announce that Senator Moore has 130 seniors from his Legislative District 24, visiting with us today, all schools in his district. It's State Government Day in District 24. They are in both balconies. Would you people please wave and be recognized by the Legislature. We're very glad to have you visiting with us today. And while the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and I do sign engrossed LB 1041. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 1013A has a motion to return offered by Senator Wesely. The amendment is found on pages 1465 of the Journal.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Mr. Speaker and members, this is a quick amendment. There is an appropriation on the A bill of \$100,000 that is struck. It's struck from 104,000 back down to \$5,000. So, essentially, this reduces the A bill \$500,000. I would move for the return of the bill and the amendment. This reflects the committee amendments that were adopted and I missed it and didn't get the A bill amended and we need to do this to reduce the A bill to reflect the committee amendments we adopted.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Discussion on the motion to return the bill. If not, those in favor of the motion, please vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.
