

Mavericks and the sports at UN-O and I can understand why there would be a concern for it. But if you take a look at the second page of the Hall amendment, take a look at it, what it says, basically, is you've got a pickle-selling licensed organization. They can sell pickles, they can reap a certain amount of pickle revenue. They can then turn around and give 20 percent of that revenue to a not-for-profit organization. Now the not-for-profit organization is not a licensed organization, necessarily. It can be any nonprofit so long as that nonprofit then in turn uses the money for lawful purposes in 9-309. The difficulty here is that the Department of Revenue sees the chance that what...the scam that is being done today, which is pickle profits going to consultants, to salesmen, to sales operators, could now be shuffled from one organization, the licensed organization, to, through a donation, a second not-for-profit, who would then in turn send the money on to a salesman or consultant, that the difficulty of tracking the money, keeping a clear paper trail, understanding what the money ultimately goes for and making sure that it goes for the appropriate donative purpose or charitable intent, is too difficult to track down. It is...it's potentially possible to divert money away from the donative charitable intent that may be there, that there is an opportunity for mischief if, basically, for example, as is apparently planned, the bars in Omaha create a not-for-profit organization which accepts money from the pickle operations that, in fact, it winds up doing business for. It allows for money in unscrupulous hands to be laundered, if you will, and gotten back to sales agents and operators. Now, that's a possibility. I don't say that it's a likelihood. I don't say that it's the intent, certainly, of the supporters or those who want to use it for the UN-O Mavericks. I do say...
