LB 88, 684

PRESIDENT: The rules were suspended and you have adopted the resolutions enumerated by the Clerk. We come now to Final Reading. If you'll please return to your seats, we'll begin, and it is necessary that we suspend the rules again. Senator Lynch.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lynch would move to suspend Rule 6, Section 7(b) to permit consideration of the bills scheduled for Final Reading today.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: I so move, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Okay, you've heard the motion. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. This requires 30 votes. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the suspension to permit consideration of Final Reading of bills today.

PRESIDENT: The rules are suspended for the reading of all of the bills listed on your schedule for today. Since we're on Final Reading now would you please return to your desks. Unauthorized personnel, please leave the floor. Senator Haberman, Senator Hannibal. For those students visiting us today, you are about to witness one of the nice things about the Legislature, and that is Final Reading. The Constitution requires that we read every bill on Final Reading clearly and distinctly, and you'll find out in a moment how clear and distinct it is. But there may be some motions to bring the bill back for amendments and so forth, so don't be surprised at that. Mr. Clerk, we're ready to start on LB 88.

CLERK: Mr. President, I do have motions on 88. I do have a request from the primary introducer to pass the bill over at this time, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are there any objections to pass over this bill at this time? If not, we will do so. We'll move on to LB 684.

CLERK: (Read LB 684 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 684 pass? All
