then the Board of Equalization, because of the July 9th date, having to work on a different theory that they will be equalized. We could be back with the county check board, county values and big State Board of Equalization wars in which we pressure counties to do what the manual says you are supposed to do, unless the E clause is attached. That question was asked of me. I thought perhaps others might want to know why the timing was significant. It is important for counties to know, as they are doing their work, that they need to follow the statewide manual in the setting of the values for their own counties. That is why the E clause is significant, because we are now in the cycle of value of setting, the counties will complete their work before this bill otherwise becomes effective, if it doesn't have the E clause. Thank you. With that, I'll withdraw the motion.
