ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 1160 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1160 with the emergency clause attached pass? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I guess I would ask for a check in and roll call vote since there's a number that have...apparently are absent or not voting.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Members, please check in. Members, record your presence, please. Senator Pirsch, record your presence. Senator Moore. Senator Rod Johnson, please. Senators Goodrich, Korshoj, Labeledz, Peterson, please record your presence. Senator Labeledz, please record your presence. Proceed with the roll call, Mr. Clerk, on the passage of 1160E. (Gavel.)

CLERK: (Roll call vote read. See pages 2248-49 of the Legislative Journal.) 34 ayes, 11 nays, Mr. President, on the passage of the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 1160E passes. LB 1174.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk. Senator Warner would move to return the bill. (Warner amendment appears on page 2249 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: I suppose I should start out, this is one of these bills that we didn't have ample time to discuss the other evening, but I won't. I voted against this bill and I'm not going to spend a lot of time. As you know, the bill as it is established permits the using of campaign funds for noncampaign purposes, and I appreciate the problem that is sought to be solved by the bill, but I have a very strong feeling about two things. One thing I know, and we've all seen it time and time again, when we begin to loosen up something in order to permit a very reasonable expenditure, a very reasonable cause, it inevitably, someone comes along and uses it for something further.
