

pie than others. The Governor, the Appropriations Committee, and others have had a chance at it. I am not faulting that. That is the system, but the system should also provide in a sense the fair play that we need so that your priorities can be met as well. By the way, if you think we haven't discussed these in the past, remember this. Over 50 times during the debate on 1041, over 50 times, we discussed these bills, and these issues, and these appropriations, and some of these were approved with as many as over 40 votes, some close, to over 25, but most with well over 30. This is, in fact, these spending is, in fact, and has been, in fact, the will of the Legislature in most cases with enough votes to individually override any veto if the votes were the same as they were on the bill. That is about all I want to say about it. This is a fairness, as far as I am concerned. It is an act of fairness on the part of the system to permit the priorities identified in this package of overrides to be approved by the Legislature. Please, I think for the sake of time, but for the sake of justice, support this override in total. Thank you very much.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. And the question is, the adoption of the Lynch amendment to override the package in 1041. Those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 2260 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to override the Governor's vetoes.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion prevails. Next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is by Senator Lynch. Senator Lynch would move that LB 350 become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lynch, please. Excuse me, Senator Lynch. (Gavel.) Proceed.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. President, members, being handed out right now is a document indicating a legal opinion which, hopefully, should overcome concerns about the constitutionality of LB 350. I'd like to remind you that what this bill is provides simply that anyone mailing prescription drugs into Nebraska would have to pay a \$50 registration fee and simply register. In the process of registering they would also simply provide that the
