LB 1143A, 1221

SPEAKER BARRETT: We have one other light.

SENATOR LANGFORD: Well, I call the question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Do I see five hands? I do. Shall debate cease? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 38 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Debate ceases. Senator Korshoj.

SENATOR KORSHOJ: Mr. Speaker, how much money we will need, I do not know, but we've got to pay the electrical bill and just keep the building going, but it's money that will come back, guaranteed it will come back. Move the bill. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: You've heard the closing. The question is the override of the Governor's veto of 1143A. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: (Record vote read as found on pages 2271-72 of the Legislative Journal.) 22 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, on the override of 1143A.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion fails. The Governor's veto is sustained on LB 1143A. LB 1221, Mr. Clerk. Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Could I have just one moment of clarification. I don't really care whether the A bill passed or not because I think the task force 309 has money to do what they are supposed to do. They just never had the direction. But I do want to quote from Larry Bare's testimony at the committee, just one line. "I am Larry Bare, Director of the Department of Administrative Services. I'm here today to testify to indicate that the bill is a workable bill and one which, while it will create some additional workload for us, is one that we can implement." Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 1221, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senators Johnson, Wehrbein, Lynch and Chizek would move to override the Governor's veto of LB 1221.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lowell Johnson, please.
