SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes, why don't we have everybody check in and have a roll call vote, please.

PRESIDENT: All right. The question is, shall we go under call first? All those in favor of going under call vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 5 nays, Mr. President, to go under call.

PRESIDENT: The house is under call. Now, please record your presence. Senator Smith, please. Senator Labedz, would you record your presence, please. Thank you. Senator Chambers, please. Thank you. Senator Jacky Smith. She is excused. So we are all here. Now, you wanted a roll call vote, did you? And the question is the adoption of the resolution. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Began roll call vote.)

PRESIDENT: (Gavel.) Let's have it quiet over on the south side so the Clerk can hear. Thank you.

CLERK: (Continued reading the roll call vote. of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Schellpeper, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: We would like to take the other count if
