The law is too vague. That's the same problems that we're having with this bill. As we said last week, I don't think any one of us here want abortion, that's not it, but the terms of this bill to harass and to go to the court...the courts and expect these young...

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR NELSON: ...girls, that is simply very traumatic, low income women that really have no other choices and actually some of them probably don't even realize just exactly how...even how life starts, I think, almost. Some of them are so young and so innocent and to have this forced on them or to go to the court system. So, with that, I will be supporting the amendment.
