

Pirsch, please. Senators Robak, Lindsay, Bernard-Stevens, Haberman, the house is under call. Senator Landis, the house is under call. Senators Haberman, Landis, Lindsay, and Bernard-Stevens, please report to the Chamber. Senator Landis, please check in. We have had a request for a roll call vote. Members, return to your seats. Senator Chambers, only one missing, may we proceed? Thank you. The question is, adjournment until tomorrow morning at eight o'clock. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2180 of the Legislative Journal.) 15 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President, to adjourn.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion fails. The call is raised. Back to the discussion of the Moore amendment to the amendment to strike Section 21. Senator Hannibal, would you care to discuss it? Senator Warner on deck.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Moore a question if I may.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Moore.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: If he would respond?

SENATOR MOORE: Yes.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Your goal, Senator Moore, is what, by striking this amendment?

SENATOR MOORE: Well, by striking the \$3 million appropriation, the goal is to saying yes to the study but not saying yes to the total cost of the facility yet, until you have received word back from the study.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: How does that differ from what the language of the bill is right now?

SENATOR MOORE: You appropriate the money, you really appropriate the money, I'm reading the bill the way it is, by the second year.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: The language says that nothing shall happen unless it is approved by the Legislature, which means it is the same thing as not appropriating it unless we make an affirmative action next year.
