SENATOR MORRISSEY: I ask for a call of the house, please.

PRESIDENT: All right. The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 3 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The house is under call. Will you please return to your desks and record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return so that we may continue. Thank you. Please look up to see if your light is illuminated. Senator Haberman, would you turn on Senator Pirsch's light, please. Thank you. Senator Rogers, would you record your presence, please. Thank you. We're looking for Senator Hall and Senator Labedz. Now, we're looking for Senator Hall. You want a roll call vote? All right.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: When Senator Hall gets here, yes.

PRESIDENT: Pardon me.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: When Senator Hall gets here.

PRESIDENT: Yes. Senator Hall is now...and will you take your seats, please, and we'll have a roll call vote, regular order. And the question is the adoption of the Morrissey amendment. Just a minute, Pat. Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2371-72 of the Legislative Journal.) 19 ayes, 25 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. Do you have anything further on it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I do, Mr. President. Mr. President, Senator Morrissey would move to amend the bill. (Morrissey amendment AM1750 can be found on page 2179 of the Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The call is raised. Senator Morrissey, please.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Yes, folks, I hate to bother you here. If we don't care what happens, what the health is of the people down there, I don't think we should really care who owns the facility or what their track record is. I just can't understand
