LB 15, the last of the E & R, correction, the last of the Revisor statute bills, deals with Volumes 1 and 1a. The change is to facilitate the use of computer version of the statutes where notes do not appear and apparently, as we all know, frequently in the statutes or in proposed legislation, there will be a reference to this act, various places within the legislation. This will, as I read it, will eliminate that down to not more than one place in the statute, but more importantly, where it does appear in the written statutes, it is noted a note that indicates the sections that are included which apparently is not feasible with the computer to have that same note and this will enable those people who use the computer version to be more accurate in their research of the statutes. So I would move the bill be advanced and waive closing.
