PRESIDENT MOUL: Okay, Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you, Madam President. This was a compromise left over and it is no longer needed, and rather than go on with the expense, why I choose to withdraw it right now. Thanks.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You have heard the motion to withdraw. Seeing no one seeking to address this issue, we will proceed with the vote. All those in favor please vote aye, all those opposed please vote nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the motion to withdraw LB 106.
