Madam President, Reference Committee has rereferred a number of pieces of legislation as well as referred for the first time LR 23 and LB 840. (See page 453 of the Legislative Journal. Re: LB 407, LB 540, LB 590, LB 666, LR 10.) And that is all I have at this time, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Okay, I do have a legislative resolution on my desk. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LR 22. Mr. Clerk, do you have a motion on the desk?

CLERK: Madam President, I do. Senator Robak would move to withdraw LB 362. She offered her motion yesterday. It's found on page 439 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Robak.

SENATOR ROBAK: Thank you, Madam President. Madam Speaker and members of the body, LB 362 is a bill relating to trespassing and all terrain vehicles. Another ATV bill I introduced, LB 164, was held at the Natural Resources Committee at my request. Both bills have received considerable attention from my constituents and other individuals affected by ATVs. Some very valid concerns about both bills have been raised by individuals on both sides of the question and I feel that, rather than waste the time of the Transportation Committee in hearing this bill, it would be far more advantageous to let those affected by this ATV legislation to work through these issues that both bills might come back and then I will come back next year with a bill that would be more favorable to everybody involved. And so, with that, I would just ask the body's indulgence in allowing me to withdraw LB 362. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Is there anyone wishing to speak on this issue? Seeing none, do you have any closing statement?

SENATOR ROBAK: No, thank you.
