PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. I would now like to call your attention to the south balcony of the Legislative Chambers. We have some special guests here today, guests of Senator Crosby. They are 20 students, all eighth graders, from Helen Hyatt School, here in Lincoln, Nebraska, with their teacher. Welcome to the Chambers today. Okay, we will now proceed with Item 5 on the agenda, motions. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Schellpeper would move to withdraw LB 304. Senator Schellpeper offered his motion yesterday, it's found on page 457 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Madam Chairman and members, I put in LB 304 that deals with handicapped license plates. I found out that Senator Cudaback also put in a bill almost identical, LB 113. His bill has been passed out of the committee, so I would just like to withdraw mine. I have signed onto his bill. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. Is there anyone who wishes to debate this motion? Seeing none, do you have a closing statement? Closing statement is waived. We will proceed to vote on the motion to withdraw LB 304. All those in favor please vote aye, all those opposed please vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the motion to withdraw LB 304.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion is approved, and LB 304 is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk.
