what happened. That was a significant compromise that was made with the other people, whoever they are, whatever industries are opposing LB 88. Now we have kept that commitment, we have stayed with that bill, we have not varied the 50/50 fault concept through...since 1987.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Time.

SENATOR ASHFORD: And we have moved that bill on that basis and that compromise still goes but there is...the opposition is there despite that compromise. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Ashford. I do have a couple of announcements to make at this time. We have some introductions. Our doctor of the day today, seated under the north balcony, has been Dr. Paul Paulman. Thank you very much for being with us today, Dr. Paulman.
