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the way we vote many times, the majority report of the legislative board. That said we choose not to seat Mr. Korslund. Senator Byars, I believe, was not seated conditionally, he was seated. I didn't even think he needed to have a vote to accept the minority report, but I will not argue that point. We can continue this dialogue time, after time, after time until maybe some time, and it's amazing to me when we talk about pressures. Those of us who allow ourselves to be pressured are going to get pressured, those of us who do not, are not going to get pressured. But the facts are these, the decision has been made after adequate debate on this floor. Now if we, through parliamentary procedure and other measures that are available to us, draw the argument out until maybe at some time or another someone will be off the floor, someone will be absent, someone will raise the issue, all of a sudden bang. We are not, ladies and gentlemen, in a position where I think by skillful procedure we accomplish that which legitimate debate did not accomplish. I suggest that we proceed to uphold the Chair, and I would hope that we would then soon vote on the acceptance of the minority report. I recognize Senator Withem has a motion up there. You can continue this as long as you like and maybe you will succeed, but the process will suffer and the Legislature will suffer. Each of us, I think, can support the position we have held thus far, but we cannot support using perhaps less than honorable means to achieve the goal which we seek. I would suggest that we do not vote to override the Chair, that we uphold the Chair and that we proceed. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Schmit. We'll go to Senator Chizek.

SENATOR CHIZEK: Call the question.

SPEAKER BAACK: Do I see five hands? I do. We will now proceed to vote on ceasing debate. All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 5 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Debate has ceased. Senator Landis, to close.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you. Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, let's separate some of these issues and deal with them one at a time. First is the question of dealing with the Chair's overruling of making a motion. You heard our rule.
