PRESIDENT MOUL PRESIDING

PRESIDENT MOUL: Welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chambers. Our Chaplain today is Pastor John Smeltzer from First-Plymouth Congregational Church here in Lincoln. Pastor Smeltzer.
