SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and members, because of some of the questions asked, Senator Hartnett, I just wanted to say that I voted for this to come out of committee and I do think it's a good bill and I am looking forward to the whole thing being bigger and better. So I'm surely going to support you. Thank you.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Very quickly, Mr. Speaker and members of the body, Senator Nelson, if I can add just a little bit of light. There was a program fund within the department...DED and the program was shared by not only the SAC Museum but the Buffalo Bill Ranch out at North Platte. It was a combination fund. And what most of the funds, in fact, all of the funds that I'm aware of are Cash Funds that come...came right out of the museum itself, mostly on admission. So it's money that they collected from the SAC Museum that went into that fund and so what we're basically saying is that money which actually was collected by Cash Funding through the SAC Museum, was transferred in, only that money will be going back to that. And so that's where it will be coming from the Cash Fund. And if you have anything further, you know, I would yield to Senator Nelson.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there any...Senator Nelson.

SENATOR NELSON: The Buffalo Bill fund then really would not be involved in this then, right, Senator Stevens?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: That's correct.

SENATOR NELSON: I remember a few years ago we bought, what was it, 65 acres of land or something out to Buffalo Bill, or something, and anyhow I hope it worked out well. Thank you.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Yeah, thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there any further discussion on LB 766? If not, Senator Hartnett, do you wish to close? He waives closing. We will now proceed to a vote on the advancement of LB 766. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted?
