SPEAKER BAACK: LB 789 is advanced. Before we proceed to the next bill, while the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LB 36, LB 100, LB 313, LB 330, LB 837, and LB 354. Mr. Clerk, items for the record.

CLERK: Thank you, Mr. President, I do. Your Committee on Natural Resources, whose Chair is Senator Rod Johnson, reports LB 446 to General File, LB 748 to General File with amendments, and LB 813 General File with amendments. Amendments to be printed by Senator Wesely to LB 703, and Senator Withem to LB 663. (See pages 1110-15 of the Legislative Journal.)

I have a new resolution, LR 61 by Senator Byars. (Read brief explanation. See pages 1109-10 of the Legislative Journal.) That will be laid over. That is all that I have, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Before we proceed to the next bill, I would like to remind members, again, that by noon today when we adjourn, all committee priority bills and all individual senator priority bills must be designated, by the time we adjourn today. Another announcement, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Urban Affairs will meet in Executive Session now, I believe, in Room 2102; Exec Session for Urban Affairs Committee in Room 2102. I might advise the membership that the Agriculture Committee will meet at eleven forty-five underneath the south balcony. That is all that I have, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We will now proceed to LB 732 introduced by Senator Kristensen.

CLERK: Mr. President, 732 was introduced by Senators Kristensen, Lindsay, Wickersham, Robak, Nelson, and Baack. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 23, referred to the Judiciary Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I have no committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body. LB 732 is my priority bill for this year. This is the implementing language of the constitutional amendment which was passed this past year in November, Constitutional Amendment 2.
